
# a. Proposed new charter format

**Discussion**: Director Phyllis Throckmorton explained the issues regarding the different committee charters. Also discussed was whether to put time limits on committee application submittals.

The governing documents committee agreed by consensus to have the original draft charter information titled Roles & Responsibilities, General Principles and Media Inquiries to "Common Rules for All Committees".

The governing documents committee agreed to the updated committee charter pending confirmation the charter works with copy and paste from existing charters.

**ACTION**: Lee Krimm will test the new charter against an existing charter.

# d. Rule article 4 Animal Control


Discussion: The governing documents committee agreed to the following by consensus:

# **ARTICLE 4: ANIMAL CONTROL**

4.01 The general rules of Article 3 also apply to this article.

4.02 The general manager, members of the patrol department and the environmental control officer have the authority to issue citations to the owners of animals in violation of animal control rules. The enforcement process may be initiated by making a complaint to the patrol department. Persons in violation of the animal control rules are subject to fines.

4.03 4.02 California Civil Code 4715 or its replacement section upon amendment or



replacement applies to this article and defines The term "pet" is defined as "any domesticated bird, cat, dog, rabbit, guinea pig, aquatic animal kept within an aquarium, or other animal as agreed to between the association and the homeowner property owner."

4.04 Farm animals, including but not limited to chickens, ducks, geese, goats, and pigs, are not permitted on any lot within Pine Mountain Club.

4.05 The commercial breeding/rearing of animals is not permitted on any lot within Pine Mountain Club.

4.06 A reasonable number of pets may be kept provided it does not create a nuisance or offensive odor or disturbance to neighbors so as to interfere with the enjoyment of life or property. A reasonable number shall be defined as the number that does not create a noxious or offensive activity.

4.07 Pets shall not be left outside unattended between dusk and dawn.

4.08 Pets shall be sheltered and protected from the weather, whether hot or cold, at all times.

4.09 Pets shall be supplied sufficient food as often as the feeding habits of the respective animals require. Pets shall be supplied with clean drinking water at all times.

4.10 Every reasonable precaution shall be used to ensure animals are not abused, abandoned or neglected as defined by Kern County Ordinance 7.08.110 or its replacement or amendment.


4.11 Dogs must be leashed and under control at all times by the owner or caretaker while on Association roads or property. Leashed dogs are permitted on PMCPOA greenbelt areas and trails, the area immediately adjacent to Fern's Lake and the campground area. Dogs may be unleashed only within the fenced dog park area.

4.12 Dogs are not allowed on the private property of others without the permission of the property owner. Dogs, except service dogs, are not allowed inside the post office, at Lampkin park, on the golf course or in the clubhouse.

4.13 Excessive and/or habitual barking, howling, whining or yelping is prohibited.

4.14 Dog owners and/or caretakers are responsible for picking up and properly disposing of their dog's waste.

4.15 Dogs shall not be tethered on any lot for longer than three (3) consecutive hours.



4.16 Pets shall not be left unattended on any lot longer than twelve (12) consecutive hours.

4.17 Pets shall not be left unattended in vehicles parked anywhere on Association property.

4.18 All reported dog bite incidents will be referred to Kern County Animal Services. In a dog bite incident, dogs found to be in violation of PMCPOA animal control rules shall be subject to citation.


4.03 No animals of any kind may be raised, bred, or kept on any residential lot in PMCPOA except the following

- A. Pets kept in aquariums or cages (such as domesticated birds) must be keptindoors from dusk until dawn.
- B. A reasonable number of pets as defined in 4.02 provided they are not kept, bredor maintained for any commercial purposes and are kept under control at alltimes. A reasonable number shall be defined as the number that does not create a noxious or offensive activity. A noxious or offensive activity by an animal isdefined in this rule as aggressive behavior, running at large, generating anoxious odor, howling, yelping, barking, or making other noise which isoffensive to the senses, is injurious to health, disturbs or annoys persons orneighbors so as to interfere with the enjoyment of life or property. In the eventof an animal bite Pine Mountain Club will follow Kern County Animal Control-Code 7.08.080 or its replacement or amendment.

4.04 Three (3) dogs and/or three (3) cats are the maximum number permitted at anyresidence. (Note: This requirement is currently in EC Code section 20)

4.05 Farm animals, including but not limited to chickens, ducks, geese, pygmy goats, and pot-bellied pigs, are not permitted on any residential lot within Pine Mountain Club.

4.06 Pets shall be sheltered and protected as defined in Kern County ordinance section 7.08.110 or its replacement or amendment which reads in part: "Every person...who owns any animal...shall comply with each of the following conditions: ...shall provide proper shelter and protection from the weather for all animals at all times;...shall notdisplay animals bearing evidence of malnutrition, ill health, unhealed injury or havingbeen kept in an unsanitary condition;...all animals shall be supplied with sufficient goodand wholesome food and water as often as the feeding habits of the respective animals



require;...every reasonable precaution shall be used to ensure that animals are not teased, abused, mistreated, annoyed, tormented or in any manner made to suffer by any person or means..."

4.07 Dogs must be on a leash when on designated areas of Association property. Kern-County Ordinance code section 7.08.150 A or its replacement section upon amendmentor replacement which reads in part: "It is unlawful for the owner of any dog to allow it to be on the private property of another person or public property without the consent of the person owning, occupying or controlling the property."

4.08 The general manager, members of the patrol and the environmental control officerhave the authority to issue citations to the owners of animals in violation of animalcontrol rules 1. The enforcement process may be initiated by making a complaint to the patrol department. Persons in violation of the animal control rules are subject to fines. This includes both members and guests.


4.09 Leashed dogs are permitted on PMCPOA greenbelt areas and trails, the baseball field area adjacent to Lampkin Park, the area immediately adjacent to Fern's Lower Lakeand the campground area (when organized events are not taking place).


