GUIDELINES



Park in designated parking areas. Parking on the road is prohibited.



Always carry tire chains. Chain control is enforced pending weather conditions.



First Responders need access to clear roads. Do **NOT** leave cars parked on the road!



Obey Traffic Signs. Do **NOT** avoid signs. Drive with caution.



Do **NOT** trespass onto Private Property to access snow. Play in designated snow play areas.



Stay hydrated. Recycle your trash. Always lock your vehicle and never leave valuables in plain sight.

Will I need Tire Chains?

Tire chains or other traction devices are required to be carried within the vehicle at all times. Chain control may be enforced.

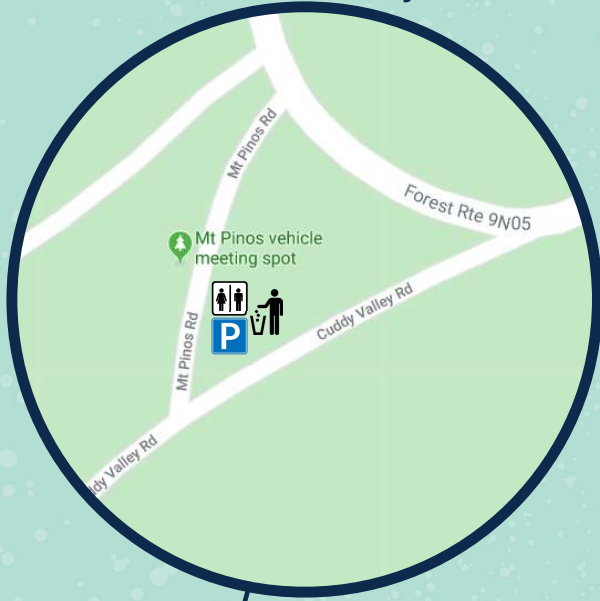

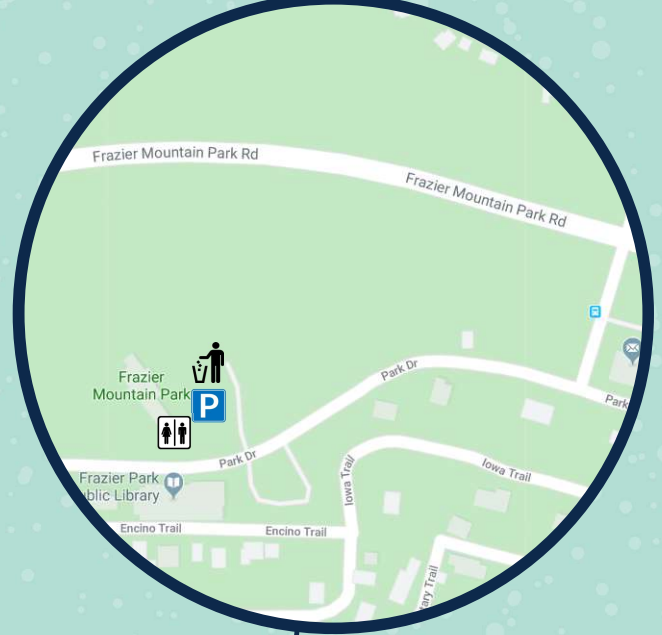
